**COY STREET & CHESTNUT STREET STORM WATER REPAIR PROJECT**

Our engineers and I visited the above site on March 18<sup>th</sup> and viewed the damage to the existing culvert under Coy Street. It appeared that over the year's storm water runoff has damaged the existing pipe west of Coy Street along the south property lines of Mickler Field. We also examined the condition of the exiting culvert under Coy Street at this location and determined that the storm water runoff damaged this culvert under Coy Street to a point of imminent failure. The existing culvert and piping system downstream of the culvert is beyond its useful life.

All of the pipe has been installed and the waterway was cleared & cleaned. The last stage is restoration which is to grade and seed; and will be done as soon as weather permits.

**CLINGAN ROAD SAFETY UPGRADE PROJECT UPDATE**

The above project was hindered by many days of rain; and I would like to thank the residents whom have had patients, extended their comments and provided suggestions to us at a meeting held on March 19<sup>th</sup> at the construction site. The project is completed and they are presently working on restoration (grading & seeding) of the area.

This project includes improvements to Clingan Road from the intersection of Center Street south to the city limits, just past Babic Street. The work included the installation of curb and gutter, catch basins, storm sewers, new driveway approaches and an asphalt overlay.

**2011 LITTER CLEAN UP**

Over 120 residents, students and city administrators turned out on Saturday, April 30<sup>th</sup>, at Mauthe Park to keep the Struthers Clean Up rolling for the 4<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Officials led work groups to perform trash pickup in alleyways, parking lots, school grounds, ditches and roads throughout the city.

Officials that led crews were the following: Councilmen Tony Fire, Bob Burnside, Bob Carcelli, III, Mike Patrick, and Bob Stouffer.

All four wards were serviced with work groups comprised of Struthers High School students, basketball & baseball team members, members of the Interact Club, the National Honor Society, the Struthers Historical Society, city officials and residents.
