



# 5TH STREET SIDEPATH

## PID 122140 MAH-STRUTHERS-SRTS

The City of Struthers, in partnership with ODOT, is developing plans for pedestrian and cyclist safety infrastructure on Poland Struthers Road (SR-616) and 5th Street.

This project is **100%** funded through **ODOT's Safe Routes to School** program and is focused on serving students attending Struthers City Schools.

All proposed improvements will be constructed within the public right of way. Driveway aprons will also be replaced.



### **NEW SIDEWALK**

New 7-foot wide **sidewalk** will be built along the east side of Poland Struthers Road (SR-616) from Beechwood Drive to Poland Avenue.

### **SHARED-USE PATH**

An 11-foot wide **shared-use path** will be built along the east side of 5th Street from Poland Avenue to Elm Street, replacing the existing 5-foot wide sidewalk. To achieve this, 5th Street will be "right-sized" with new pavement markings including centerlines, edge lines, and high-visibility crosswalks.

### **TRAFFIC CALMING**

Traffic calming elements, including **speed cushions**, **curb bump-outs**, and **landscaping**, will be incorporated from Elm Street to Midlothian Boulevard to improve safety for all transportation modes.

## SHARED-USE PATH

A **shared-use path (SUP)** is a multiuse path that is physically separated from motor vehicle traffic by an open space or barrier. Path users may include:

- People who are walking, running, or using wheelchairs (both non-motorized and motorized)
- Adults and children riding bicycles
- Inline skaters, roller skaters, skateboarders, kick scooter users, and users of other micromobility devices
